SAPC Membership

The council membership is 19 metropolitan and 9 country societies and allows for delegates from all 28 affiliated South Australian and Northern Territory societies, one from the local trade and one from Australia Post.

The Council owns a property at 22 Gray Court, Adelaide, which houses the Australian Philatelic Federation Store, an office for the Circuit Book Scheme, storage facilities, the SAPC Archive and a meeting hall.

The SAPC also has positions for an Archives Officer (Anthony Presgrave) Souvenir Product Sales (Vacant), Congress Co-Ordinator (Linda Welden) and a SAPC News editor (Linda Welden with the assistance of Dianne Shaw and Dianne James).

The South Australian Philatelic Council would like to welcome Di Shaw to the Management committee. Di is a member of Community Philatelic Society and has the role of their delegate. At the November AGM it was proposed that Di take on the role of Publicity Officer. Her first priority is the setting up of a website for the Council.

SAPHIL House

The Council owns a property at 22 Gray Court, Adelaide, it is the home of the Philatelic Society of South

Australia, including their Commonwealth and SA Study Groups, The Australian Airmail Society, Postal Stationery & Postal History Society of Australia, the Australian Postcard Society the SA Branch of the Australian Match Cover Collectors Society, The Printed Collectables Club and Glenside Philatelic Society.

SAPC Awards

The Council makes available a number of awards each year:

- The Briskham Award, for meritorious service to Philately in South Australia, was awarded to Geoff Edwards from the Port Pirie Philatelic Society in 2021.
- The Harry Butler Award, for services to a particular society, was awarded to Frank Chester from City of Noarlunga in 2021.
- The Maria Mincoff Award for Youth was not presented in 2021.
- These awards are presented in October.

The Year's Events

- We have once again been able to celebrate holding a one day Bourse at SAPHIL House with dealers in attendance, The purpose of these fairs is to assist our Philatelic members in purchasing material, to get the Philatelic members and public together socially and for the different members of each club to get to know each other. Many clubs have taken the opportunity to use the facilities at SAPHIL to run these one and two day events during 2021/2022.
- The SAPC has conducted further Saturday and Sunday auctions at SAPHIL House, and they are still proving to be popular. With catalogues being produced and circulated not only within SA but to other States.
- Eastern Districts in October 2021 held another very successful Congress, with 4 clubs and 10 individual, plus 2 youth, 3 State, 1 Literature and 1 non-competitive entry. Para Hills won the Arnold Keller Trophy for Best Club entry.
- In February 2022 the Committee organised a High Tea to thank all the volunteers who took part in organising and supporting events in Saphil House during 2021 and 2022. Without the support of all the volunteers we would not have been able to keep the Philatelic members and the Treasurer happy. They not only kept the Circuit book office functioning, they also kept The SAPC Stamp auctions possible and they supported the SAPC during events being run in Saphil house during the last twelve months. We also took the opportunity to ask David Figg the Treasurer of the APF to present Alma Downes with her SPAN Award. Alma won the award in 2021 but due to COVID the presentation night did not take place, so we took great pleasure in presenting her with her award at the High Tea.

President's Annual Report cont'd

- February 2022 the SAPC Committee held the annual dinner to honour the winners of the Briskham and Harry Butler awards, also invited were the previous APF APO winners of the MAP, Research Award and SPAN. The Briskham and Butler Award dinner was held at the Prince Albert Hotel. 25 people attended this year; 10 Briskham winners, 4 Butler winners, as well as Partners and the management committee. It was a lovely evening and great to see so many familiar faces attending the dinner
- March 2022 Martin Walker (Past President SAPC) and Committee member Gordan Oates were invited to attend on behalf of the SAPC the Campbelltown University of the Third Age. Gordon and Martin gave a philatelic presentation to the members. They gave a general talk on philately that covered the general forms of collecting from simple stamp collecting to the more specialised aspects of postal history, aerophilately and thematics. Also discussed was a review of the Adelaide club scene giving details of societies located in the north-eastern suburbs of Adelaide. Gordon gave a demonstration of the Morse Telegraph Code and spoke on the anniversary of the Overland Telegraph in August and the philatelic exhibition celebrating that occasion. A display of various philatelic collections was presented by both Gordon and Martin with the members of the campus taking a good interest. The committee of that campus are quite keen to see philately added to their curriculum and invite any local members of the philatelic community to help them.
- The SAPC committee have been working towards developing an internet and social media presence to encourage retirees and youth interested in philately. With the help of Diane Shaw (Publicity Officer) and Alex Littlewood (consultant) we have taken a step forward by establishing a website for the SAPC and its affiliated clubs.
- The APF Virtual exhibition has shown us how we can take the next step to engage the collector into keeping up their exhibiting interest as our Philatelic members are aging and with COVID exhibition have been cancelled all over the world we have been looking at new ways to encourage our members to take an active part in collecting.
- The APF (Australian Philatelic Federation) executive held a meeting at SAPHIL House in June. The SAPC Workshop and the Australian Postcard Society Open day, all have proved very popular with our members. My thanks to all for organizing these events, and to everyone for attending.
- In June Community Philatelic Society ran a live Auction at SAPHIL house it was the first face to face auction since the beginning of COVID. They had a good turn out and members were happy to take part in a live Auction again.
- To keep up our commitment to assist club members and judges to explore new areas of collecting and rules and regulations of judging the SAPC committee ran a workshop in July on Thematics, Open and Topical collection. The workshop was run for Novices and beginners. David Figg did the presentation with notes and a powerpoint presentation supplied by Stephanie Bromser. Next years workshop topics are Traditional, Cinderellas, Revenues and Frugal. The workshops are free and educational and entertaining.

Other events which took place at Saphil were the Matchbox Exhibition which was a new event and proved very popular. The 150th Anniversary of the Adelaide GPO was very informative thanks to Martin Walker for holding and organising the event.

ANPEX Exhibition

Congratulations to the organizing committee of ANPEX. Once again South Australia has put on another outstanding exhibition. Judging was held at SAPHIL House on the Thursday and Friday, set up on the Friday and the exhibition was held over two days with the pull down on the Sunday night. Thank you to all the volunteers who helped with set up and pull down. ANPEX celebrated the 150th Amiversary of the Overland Telegraph and this was the theme of the show. The presence of the North East Radio Club allowed for a Morse telegraph link from the foyer to the receiving area on the stage of the exhibition. Once again congratulations to all.

From the Treasurer's desk

The SAPC Books are about to go to the Auditor for preparation of the Financial Report for the 2021/22 year for tabling at the AGM scheduled for Monday 14 November.

The cheque account is kept on a cash basis whereas the end-of-year financials are prepared on an accruals basis.

For the last financial year (and spilling over into the current financial year), the finances have been helped tremendously with the injection of significant funds from the postal bid auctions that were held. These generated a surplus of \$16,887.93 which will help towards the running of SAPHIL House.

The Council is indebted to the services of Mike Kovaleff, Peter Siggs and John Walker for making this happen.

Overall the year has been a much healthier one with a surplus of income over expenses.

SAPHIL House is now utilised most days of the month by the CBO, APF Store, and the regular clubs that meet there – Philatelic Society of SA, Australian Airmail Society, Glenside Philatelic Society, Postal Stationery & Postal History, Printed Collectables Club and the Australian Match Cover Collectors Society. In addition, Club Open Days and Fairs, Auctions, a National Match Exhibition, and a State Congress have all contributed to the income stream, helping to close the gap on the costs of keeping SAPHIL House running.

The Circuit Book Office (CBO) are separate to the SAPC. A separate report is given by the CBO Manager at the AGM and they also contribute their share of tax, which we have to pay to the ATO on any interest earned on investments.

The CBO is well staffed with volunteers and additional people are coming on board. We are currently seeking additional pages of material due to high turnover.

Sales are progressing well and results similar to the last two years are expected.

With increasing banking costs and lack of bank support for cheques the CBO will be forced to use direct deposits and internet banking.

The CBO is financially stable.

The Circuit Book Office (CBO) operates Monday to Friday during the day staffed by volunteers. Occasionally due to shortages the office is unstaffed. It is prudent to phone first to ensure the office is open. Vacancies exist for additional volunteers. Vendors are encouraged to forward more sheets of material as we are turning over hundreds of sheets per week. If you would like to become a vendor, please contact the CBO on 8212 3557. If your club has a request for specific books, please ring the office and ask for myself.

APF Award

Anthony Presgrave - Member of the Australian Philatelic Order



Tony had a childhood collection but started specialised collecting in 1970 and formed collections of Australian Commonwealth, South Australian Departmentals and general issues, River Murray Shipping, Travelling Post Offices of South Australia, Picture Postcards and more recently the Slogan Cancellations of the Adelaide GPO and Postmarking Machines in South Australia. Many of these collections have been exhibited with some achieving Gold and Large Gold medals.

Being a member of over ten clubs and societies, Tony has been recognised with a Fellowship from three (RPSL, RPSV & ACCC) and Life Membership of the Philatelic Society of South Australia. Tony has served continuously on the SA Philatelic Council since 1995 with three separate stints as the Judges Registrar, his current position, amounting to 18 out of the 26 years served to date. In recognition of his services to philately in South Australia, Tony was awarded the Briskham Medal in 1995, the highest award bestowed by the SAPC.

In 2002, Tony received the Australian Philatelic Order Research Award. Author of three books – Albury Postal Services 1975, The Departmental Stamps of South Australia 1992 and The Travelling Post Offices of South Australia 1997, he was also joint author of a fourth, The Railway Parcel Stamps of Australia 1980. Currently editor of two journals, Tony was also Cinderella Corner columnist for Stamp News for 15 years.

Tony has been the APF Frames Project Officer for the last 15 years, Cinderella Class Convenor for the last 13 years and APF Research Officer for South Australia for the last 10 years.

Apprenticed in 1992, Tony's judging career spans almost thirty years during which time he has judged in every state of Australia except Tasmania. He is currently accredited to judge Traditional, Postal History, Literature, Open, Picture Postcards and One Frame. Tony has been a Team Leader on numerous occasions and was Jury Chair for Adelaide Stampex 2008.

An accredited Commissioner to National Exhibitions since 1992, Tony has also been the Australian Commissioner to overseas exhibitions.

Tony has promoted the hobby through numerous displays and talks at local service clubs, and a periodic display in his local post office culminating in his being instrumental in obtaining Australia Post approval for the issue of postage stamps in 2003 to commemorate the 150th anniversary of shipping on the River Murray system.

Tony Presgrave is well deserving of being recognised as a Member of the Australian Philatelic Order.

Philatelic Society of South Australia

The Philatelic Society of South Australia was founded in 1888 and has the distinction of being the oldest continuously operating society in Australia and is believed to one of the ten oldest in the world. For the first time in its long history a woman - Jennifer Mibus - was elected as President for 2022!

Jennifer started in philately when she attended the SAPC Junior Stamp Club in 1988, which was also the 100th anniversary of PSSA. She joined PSSA as a junior in 1993. During her long membership, Jen has worked on the PSSA Committee in various capacities including membership secretary and she is also currently SAPC Delegate representing the PSSA at their quarterly meetings.

Jen has exhibited at many State Congresses and provided displays at the PSSA as well as for other clubs and societies. Jen is a regular volunteer at the set up and the pulldown at both State and National exhibitions and attends the SAPC auctions, volunteering her services at the main table. Jen was the recipient of The Butler Award in 2019.

Numismatic Society of SA (Coin and Bank Note Expo)

Due to the two previous annual events being cancelled due to Covid restrictions, South Australian collectors were keen to embrace collecting again and formed a very long queue for free entry on the first day of the expo.

There were a number of factors that probably contributed to the success of the show. The absence of an Adelaide coin show for the previous three years, the \$2 coin collecting craze, the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, the fine weather and the extensive advertising. Collectors were keen to buy and sell many of the scarcer \$2 commemorative coin varieties, and obtain coins with the effigy of the late Queen.

Two hundred specially overprinted PNCs were produced for the show with small quantities supplied to dealers with tables and the lowest two numbers allocated as the first prize in the raffle.

There were regular raffle draws throughout the three days with a lady winning the numbers 1 and 2 of the special show PNC's for 150 years of the Overland Telegraph, and David, in charge of the raffles, drawing his own winning ticket for a series of donated coin albums after purchasing only five tickets!

Our Society invites coin and banknote collectors, interested members of the public and their friends to attend our meetings, which are held on the third Thursday of each month at 7.45pm. Every third month (November, May, February, August) a Numismatic Bourse is held before the meeting, commencing at 7pm.

An annual Coin Expo is held by the NSSA, usually in October where possible, with the dates for our sixth annual Coin Expo in 2023 to be announced.

Meetings are held at the rooms of the Royal Society of South Australia, ground floor, behind the State Library, Entry: off Kintore Avenue, via rear lane (Morgan Thomas Lane) immediately behind the State Library, walk along lane 60-70 metres, then turn left into Plane Tree Court. Take the first door on the left. If you are driving, use the intercom at the boom gate at the entrance to the lane, and advise that you are attending the Numismatic Society coin meeting and, on entry, you may proceed to park behind the Library, Museum or Art Gallery buildings.

Phil a member of the Australian Postcard Society discovered this very rare postmark of Winninowie while looking through a collection of postcards.

Winninowie is a locality in the Mid North of South Australia. It includes the intersection of Horrocks Pass Road, Winninowie is 21 kilometres southeast of Port Augusta on the plain between Spencer Gulf on the west and the southern Flinders Ranges on the east. Winninowie Post Office opened on 1 September 1880 and closed on 31 May 1928.

Community Philatelic Society: Memories

In 1986 on the 150th anniversary of South Australia, a re-enactment was held in Encounter Bay of the meeting between Matthew Flinders and Nicolas Baudin in 1802. To commemorate the anniversary, the Community Philatelic Society decided to organize a bus trip to coincide with the event.

It was also decided to produce a set of 3 special covers, one each for the ships taking part - the British ship HMS Amazon; the French Ship Commandant Blaison, and the Australian ship HMAS Flinders. There were 400 sets in total, each set with a printed number. The Captains of each ship personally signed all 400 covers for their ship!



Given the Royal family connection to the Navy, one of our members suggested that we offer set number 1 to Her Majesty the Queen. We wrote a letter to accompany the covers and sent them to Buckingham Palace. To our delight, we received a reply from the Queen's Assistant Private Secretary.



Maximaphily Exhibition Class

What is Maximaphily?.

The expression *carte-maximum* (maximum card or maxicard) was first used in 1932, when a collector named Lecestre published an article on *Le Libre Échange* detailing the design of this philatelic item.





The study, creation and collection of maximum cards is called maximaphily.

Maximaphily did not become organised until after the Second World War. Before then maximum cards were created as novelties, often by tourists.

Maximaphily is closely associated with thematic or topical stamp collecting and many thematic collections are enhanced with appropriate maximum cards.



A maximum card (maxicard, maxi-card, MC) is made up of three elements: the postcard, the stamp and the postmark. The object of maximaphily is to obtain a card where the stamp and picture are in close concordance, ideally with an appropriate cancellation too. If all three elements are concordant, then that card truly is a maximum [concordance] card (hence the name maximaphily). Preferably, the image on the postcard should not be simply an enlargement of the image on the stamp. There are exceptions. For example: a work of art, like a painting (not a detail of it), is often shown

in its entirety, both on the postcard and on the stamp of the maxicard.



A maximum card for the birth bicentenary of <u>Nikolai</u> <u>Gogol</u> where the card, stamp and first day of issue postmark are in concordance. As are the birds on the right.

ANPEX President's Report

150th Anniversary of the completion of the Overland Telegraph Line and 50th Anniversary of ANPEX 1972.

The SA Philatelic Council presented the year's only National One-Frame Exhibition at the Hectorville Community Centre on 20-21 August 2022.

To commemorate the telegraph anniversary the organising committee encouraged exhibits of telegram forms and stamps and exhibits in the usual philatelic classes with a connection to the telegraph service. Ten exhibitors took up this challenge with material from the Australian Colonies and Commonwealth and from Ecuador being shown.

The organisers also arranged for larger exhibits to tell the story of the Telegraph in Australia (Patricia Wood) and Telecommunications (Marilyn Syme).

To strengthen the telegraph connections the exhibition was a part of the wider sesquicentenary commemorations, and the OTL-150 organisers are thanked for their support and promotion of ANPEX 2022.

Working demonstrations of morse code and amateur radio communications were provided by members of the North East Radio Club and provided fascinating displays. Their participation also allowed visitors to ANPEX to send and receive souvenir telegrams and 98 were sent during the weekend. Special forms and telegram message stamps were produced by the organisers.

The fiftieth anniversary of ANPEX 1972 was also celebrated at the exhibition with a reunion of people associated with the original exhibition and special displays by John Walker and Jeff Newman. Four exhibitors, Clyde Ziegler, Ben Clemmensen, Jeff Newman and Martin Walker formed a special group who exhibited at both the 1972 and 2022 exhibitions.

In total the exhibition displayed 84 frames of material plus more at the ANPEX reunion. Of these 61 one-frame exhibits were entered into the competition for judging by the APF appointed jury. This jury comprised Anthony Presgrave (Chairman), Glen Stafford (Secretary), Michael Blinman, Charles Bromser, Mohammed Islam and Philip Levine. They were assisted by Neville Solly (X-Aide operator).

The Best in Show was awarded to Mark Diserio for his Australia – Lettercards Stamped to Order and the Best Telegraph Exhibit was awarded to Dave Elsmore for his Electric Telegraph Queensland. In total the exhibits were awarded 8 Large Gold, 6 Gold, 14 Large Vermeil, 13 Vermeil, 8 Large Silver, 5 Silver, 5 Silver-Bronze and 1 Bronze. One 'no-show' was substituted by an exhibit on Cyclone Tracy.

One of the most pleasing aspects of the competition was the number of new exhibits. According to the entry form details, 39 exhibits had their debut showing. A quarter of these comprised the experimental Telegraph Class.

Apart from the fascinating exhibits on show, there was plenty to see and buy at the trade stands by Richard Juzwin, Tony Shields, Abacus Auctions, John Cornelius, David Figg and the Australian Philatelic Federation.

Finally, thank-yous are due to my fellow organising committee members – Gordon Oates, David Figg, Stuart Wattison, John Moore, Jenny Roland and her volunteer caterers, all of the volunteers who helped during the show and the general public who took time to visit and enjoy everything on offer.

Sally Hopton at ANPEX

Sally popped into ANPEX seeking information about her stamps as well as to share the story of her great-grandfather Edward Meade Bagot, Ned. Ned was involved in laying out a section of the Overland Telegraph!

This is an extract from Ned's story as told by Sally.

My great-grandfather Edward Meade Bagot—Ned Bagot—was born in Ireland in 1822. He was a son of Charles Hervey Bagot. In 1840 Ned accompanied his father and family to South Australia. He worked for his father at the Koonunga Station near Kapunda. When copper was

discovered, he helped run the mines. He later ran pastoral stations on the River Murray and at Beefacres.

When the Overland Telegraph was projected, Ned tendered for, and won, the contract for the southernmost section of the line; about 500 miles from Port Augusta to Mt Margaret near Oodnadatta. There were seven or eight other tenders. Ned's knowledge of the bush probably helped him win the contract. He tendered for varying amounts per mile depending on the distance from 'civilization', ranging from £20-70 per mile and averaging £41.

Ned had moved his men out of Adelaide to start the Southern Section on the 27th of September the remainder left on the Lubra for Port Augusta. They arrived on 30 September and immediately set up camp at Stirling, 5 miles away. The following day, Saturday 1st October, they planted their first pole. Superintendent Towler gave each man a glass of beer and that was the end of the ceremony. In fact, they had several more poles up by the end of the day. The work was now in progress at either end of the route. Ned had his section completed by the due date of 1st January 1872. He also ran the carting of materials and stores to the central section. On completion of his contract, he had received £38,000.

It has to be said that the southern section was considered the easiest, but Charles Todd was very pleased with the work and said so in a letter to Ned,

"...the 500 or more miles of telegraph constructed by you under contract formed a very important portion of the Port Darwin line...the services rendered in carting materials and stores to the central sections were most valuable. For undertaking these large contracts in the face of unknown, and really very great difficulties, you deserve great credit and have my cordial thanks."

Antarctic Stamp and Postcard Exhibition

The 2020 COVID-postponed Antarctic Stamp and Postcard Exhibition was finally held from Fri 26/8 to Sun 28/8/2022 at Princes Wharf No. 1, Hobart Docks as part of the Antarctic Festival.

Held under the auspices of the Australian Philatelic Federation as a non-competitive specialised exhibition, it attracted 17 exhibits (52 frames) and 6 dealers, with Australia Post attending just on the Friday. Support was received from the Antarctic Festival, Australia Post, Tasmanian Philatelic Society, Australian Stamps Professional and the Adelaide Mint.

A special three course dinner was held on the opening night at Hadley's Orient Hotel. This was booked out well before the Show. Guests were treated to the same menu that Douglas Mawson and his crew had on the eve of their departure for the Antarctic back in 1911.

Antarctic displays were also on show at the Salamanca Arts Centre, Public Library and the Maritime Museum. Of course the full-scale replica of Mawson's Huts were also open to the public throughout the Festival, and the Salamanca Markets could also be visited on the Saturday.

All the above-mentioned attractions and events were within easy walking distance of Hadley's Orient Hotel where most visitors stayed. A good number of collectors and exhibitors attended from around Australia with one keen philatelist visiting from the UK.

One Frame exhibits can be in any of the international (<u>Federation Internationale de Philatelie -FIP</u>) classes except Literature and also any of the Australian National classes. See <u>https://apf.org.au/classes/</u> for more information.

There have been changes made to the One Frame Class rules to make it easier for new exhibitors. You can read about the changes. To assist new exhibitors to understand how to improve their exhibit, judges will be asked to provide constructive critiques and explain any issues with the scope of the exhibit. The National One Frame guidelines say "In all cases where a One-frame Exhibit could be shown in more than one frame, the exhibitor should be advised in feedback this is the case."


Photographs of any of the post offices and staff in these places.




