

Honouring Gerry van Ekelenburg



The Glenside Philatelic Society is pleased to sponsor the May issue of the SAPC News colour edition in honour of founding member Gerry van Ekelenburg.



Gerry formed the Blackwood Society in 1979/80. He was a member for about 2 years until he started working at the Glenside Hospital and this started the process of forming the Glenside Club.

Gerry, along with Charles Niitoja were the founding members of Glenside. They approached the management of Glenside Hospital to enquire if they might start a stamp club to service the South East Districts. Authorisation was obtained 20th October 1980 and the first meeting was held on the 21st of January 1981 occupying rooms within the hospital facilities.

With an attendance of some 25 people policies etc were established. Gerry was appointed Chairman (president) and remained in this position until the 4th August 2018.

Glenside moved to the Rosefield Uniting Church in 2009, due to Glenside Hospital being sold. At the end of 2019 due to COVID 19 virus the decision was made to move the meetings to SAPHIL House, on the 1st and 3rd Saturdays of the month. The club now has 35 active members. The club has made the move from night to day meetings and this has helped to increase our membership.

Gerry's prized collection was the South Australian Postmarks Squared Circles 1880 - 1920. Gerry's name will be remembered at Glenside as one of its awards bears his name.

The Briskham Award is presented by the SAPC to a club member who has given many years of outstanding service to philately in South Australia. The award is named in honour of AG Briskham who was president of the Philatelic Society of South Australia.



Trevor Pope 2022 Recipient

Trevor was an active member of the Moonta and Snowtown Philatelic Societies for 5 years, from 1968-70 and 1974-75, and attended the ETSA Stamp Club as a visitor from 1971 before being accepted as an Associate Member when the ETSA Constitution was changed. He attended there until he transferred to the Blackwood club.

He was elected as President at Blackwood in July 1986 and served in this capacity for 9 years before stepping down to Vice-President for 2 years from 1995 - 1997. He resumed as Vice-President in 2016. He introduced Circuit Books to the club in 1986 and managed them for 34 years and he is still assisting with these. He has been the Club Programme Co-Ordinator for 36 years and has served as Treasurer and Secretary. He has held the role of Financial Examiner since 2017.

He introduced exchange visits with other clubs and these are still well received by members and visitors. He also ran a session at meetings for the juniors who attended periodically, and promoted philately with special displays at the Blackwood Post Office. He has co-ordinated three Super Auctions and will do so again this year, with all being very successful.

Trevor has held multiple positions since 1986, and at one stage, he performed the duties of all positions until he could encourage others to take on some of the load. He was a member of the SAPC Executive Committee for 10 years from 1980 - 90, and served as Treasurer during this period. He was also club delegate for 13 years from 1980 - 93. He was a member of Stampex 86 Exhibition Executive Committee and Interim Treasurer from 1981 - 83.

Trevor was awarded Life Membership of the Blackwood Philatelic Circle in July 2004.

Congratulations Trevor on behalf of the SAPC and all philatelic members.

The Butler Award is given to club members who, over the years has given meritorious service to their club or society, and philately in general.



Paul Bennison 2022 Recipient

Paul joined the Para Hills Philatelic Society some 35 years ago attending meetings with his daughters Natalie and Pauline.

Paul is also a musician and member of the local town band. It is no surprise that his philatelic pursuits relate to music and famous composers and songs. For many of his 35 years of membership Paul has served on the committee of the society in several roles. A general committee member for 1990 and 1991 and continuously from 2008 to date. He was the society's treasurer from 2011 to 2015 and then secretary from 2016 to the present date.

Since 2015 he is also the society's librarian and from 2020 the Publicity Officer.

During his tenure as treasurer Paul oversaw the transfer of the Society's accounts from paper to electronic formats.

In 2019 he led a working party to produce a complete revision of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Society to accommodate recent changes to the Associations Incorporation Act.

Paul has introduced to the members of the society a wide ranging knowledge of music, composers, operas, classics and even Christmas Carols, and we believe he has also introduced philately to his local band members.



Arthur H Bergen

Personal Reminiscences by John Bodnar



Arthur Bergen passed away on April 28, 2013. It is the tenth anniversary this year since he left us. Yes he is gone, but is not forgotten and wont be by me. With the Harry Butler Award presentation for 2022 to Paul Bennison (Congratulations!!!) not long since taken place, it is fitting to remember the man who provided the trophy.

I would like to share some of my reminiscences I have of "young at heart', Arthur H. Bergen who always had a twinkle in his eyes and walked with a spritely step. In the course of a lifetime we meet many different people like "ships in the night". A few leave an indelible impression on us. They are truly special and we are better for and privileged for having had them in our lives. Arthur H. Bergen was such a man. He was nature's gentleman, always had a positive outlook, regardless of his situation and would always answer when questioned on how he was, with the response - "Never Better".

I came to know Arthur after joining the Australian Airmail Society (AAS). He was a charismatic man who drew people to himself because of the life and philatelic experiences he would share with us all. He was headstrong and never suffered fools gladly and when riled would respond vigorously pointing out the misconceptions of his protagonist. He was intelligent, creative (his philatelic emissions are a testimony to this observation) and had a dry sense of humour. I asked him once what the "H" stood for in his name. He responded by saying I would find out when he was dead. He was right – I did and it stood for Hugo.

I got to know him well over a number of years and he became a father figure to me. We had a number of interstate travelling experiences together to do with philatelic endeavours. He was a most pleasant travelling companion. It causes me to smile when I remember how he would chat to me inanely to make sure I stayed awake when we were on the road at night. I was humoured by his thoughtfulness but pleased that he showed understanding and was concerned.

He always thanked me for taking him saying if it wasn't for me he would not be able to go. It was my pleasure absolutely, my reward was seeing him happy and enjoying life. We drove over to a Stamp Exhibition in Melbourne one year and stayed at the Arden Motel. There Arthur introduced me to a ritual of his. He pulled out a draw of the bedside table and autographed it underneath before replacing it. He informed me that he began this ritual when he worked for Wrigley's as a Traveller and still carried on doing it whenever he went away.

In the mornings after breakfast I would make Arthur a sandwich for lunch and supply a bottle of orange juice for him, then we would go to the venue. I would leave him to his own devices in the seated area and would go off to do my Judging. I would check on him periodically to find him the centre of attention engaged in conversation with the many people he knew there. He informed me how great a time he had there and was happy he went.

The Cover Society wanted to honour Arthur at a special meeting in Melbourne so I drove him over. It was pleasing to see him receiving recognition for the huge output of philatelic covers he had produced. A special monograph was produced detailing his life's philatelic output.

I was chuffed at being able to attend this event honouring Arthur. On our arrival at the venue Arthur presented the members present with a raffle ticket. I did not expect to be given a ticket but Arthur insisted that I have one. The prize was a special cover signed by Sir Edmund Hillary and Sherpa Tenzing. When it was drawn and the number called I was gobsmacked, it was my number, I won the cover, I was blown away, it was surreal. Talk about good karma.

Our trip to the Lake Boga Aviation Museum celebrations provided an unexpected and disturbing surprise. I was driving and Arthur was dozing in the front passenger seat as we were entering Swan Hill to find the road had been funnelled into one traffic lane. The NSW and Victorian Number plated cars ahead of me were allowed to go straight through. I was forced to stop and yelled at by the Police to stop the car and get out. I was breathalized, had to produce my license, the Sergeant yelled to his radio man across the road to check whether I had any oustanding warrants out on me. Then was ordered to open the boot and the car was checked for roadworthiness. Luckily all was clear and we were allowed to proceed on our way. Arthur had thankfully dozed through the whole experience. I woke him up on arrival at our booked accommodation.

I found out next day that an Adelaide man had been grooming a young Melbourne girl who he arranged to meet at Swan Hill. Unfortunately I ticked all the wrong boxes re; height, weight, hairstyle, car model and colour. How scary is that? They were apprehended at Narracourte the next day, thank goodness.

Mothers' Chair Appeal, Cinderella New Zealand, 1930

This New Zealand stamp/fund raising coupon was probably produced sometime in January 1930 for a short fundraising campaign that ended in June 1930. I have no information on who designed or printed this stamp, but I assume it was the New Zealand Obstetrics Society.

In one of many advertisements throughout NZ at the time, an advertisement in the Poverty Bay Herald on 3 Feb 1930 by the New Zealand Obstetrics Society appealing for com-



munity support. The advert states: "To each woman's organisation I appeal for support. It only needs 7500 women to take each a £1 card of 20 one shilling coupons and collect from their friends. This £7500 must be collected by June 1930 to claim the Government subsidy".

So, what was the "Mothers' Chair Appeal"? Well, let me tell you the short version of this interesting stamp.

In the late 1920s, New Zealand women and children were dying at alarming rates during childbirth, so the NZ Obstetrics Society (now defunct) decided to raise funds (dollar for dollar with the Government) for the establishment of a full-time Chair of Obstetrics in connection with the Otago Medical School.

Dr Doris Gordon, Honorary Secretary of the Society, had the vision and drive to raise £25,000. This was a hugely successful campaign that predominantly networked women's organisations in a very short period (Feb-June). Dollar-for-dollar the Mothers' Chair Appeal raised an astonishing £50,000. The first Chair of Obstetrics, Sir J Bernard Dawson, was appointed as well as two Obstetrics and Gynaecology scholarships in 1932.

Frugal is the class for philatelic material that does not exceed \$12.50 per page or \$200 per frame. The research for this interesting frugal exhibit is outstanding, however, to much writing will distract the eye from the focus of the exhibit.

At National exhibitions dealers would be called in to evaluate the cost of material of the exhibit.

Fare and Ticket Validation Stamps by Tony Presgrave

A revenue exhibit comprises of many different types of embossed, imprinted, adhesive tax, fee or credit stamps that have been issued by the governing body of any country. This class is quite often transferred back to Traditional.

Cinderellas Private Railway Parcel and Freight Stamps by Tony Presgrave

The cinderella class includes many labels that resemble postage stamps, but are not part of the official payment system for the carriage of mail. While Railway stamps have also been included in the Cinderella class, they are more often classified as Traditional Class. This is a well balanced one frame exhibit.

Exhibiting tips

All the classes are judged under the rules of traditional philately. It is important to know that the judges critique of your exhibit is to encourage you to improve your exhibit. The judges are sharing their wealth of knowledge with you when they offer their comments.

One of the important aims of exhibiting is to display your exhibit as visually appealing as possible. A good way to check this is to bring your exhibit to SAPHIL House and set it up on the display boards, take a step back and get an overall view of the exhibit. Problems will become obvious. Missing a page? Have you left it on your photo copier? Visually checking how it looks on a frame is important.

Check your exhibit layout and visual accuracy at SAPHIL House on the display boards. Spotted on Monday after the workshop was Gordon Monk doing exactly that!

- \Rightarrow Balancing each page and also within the whole exhibit.
- \Rightarrow Transferring classes don't be alarmed if your exhibit is moved to a different class.
- \Rightarrow All exhibits have a title page that outlines your exhibit.
- \Rightarrow Layout page layout, be creative, but don't overpower with writing, and try not to over crowd the page.
- ⇒ Show your knowledge and research for your topic. You know best about your topic and you need to let the judges know.
- ⇒ Paper dimensions need to comply with exhibition rules, so that when they are placed in the frames so that your material is safe.
- ⇒ Technical details need to be correct refer to the changling colours, if you make a statement about technical details make sure that it is correct, if known, include printer, designer, engraver, perforations, watermark information.



Changlings: The changes in colour are due to either chemicals or contact with direct sunlight, this technical information needs to be accurate and if you are unsure, please ask for help.

Mike Munzer



It is with some melancholy that the passing of Michael H.O. Munzer is recorded. Mike, as he was popularly known, was a force majeure in this state's philatelic scene for several decades. As a school teacher he possessed a boundless energy for sharing his love of stamps, collecting, and all the things they could teach, to scores of students and youthful collectors. Mike found his love of stamps at a young age and began sharing his enthusiasm to primary school students as he worked his passage through a succession of schools in country South Australia. By the early 1970's he was near enough to Adelaide to become a member of several of the clubs in the northern suburbs and inner country.

I first met Mike when I was one of the large group of youngsters of the Para Hills society. It was Mike who introduced us all to the joys of collecting postmarks when he would arrive at meetings with bags of kiloware to pick through. Mike joined all the clubs in the north - Para Hills, Elizabeth, Hamley Bridge, the newly formed Salisbury, and Woodville and Eastern Districts in the suburbs. In 1973 he was transferred to Evanston Gardens Primary School and whilst there helped me found the Gawler club. It was a very convenient transfer for me as my parents had just moved

to Gawler and I became one of the gang of kids riding to meetings in the back of Mike's station wagon. A couple of years later Mike's teaching career had reached the city and he remained at schools in suburban Adelaide until his retirement. At one point or another Mike was a member of nearly every club in the state. In the 1980s he was a co-founder of the Enfield club that is now the Printed Collectables Club.

With such a level of involvement in the state's club scene it was inevitable that he would become involved with the SA Philatelic Association, the Stamp Promotion Council and exhibitions around the country. As a volunteer Mike must have been involved in virtually every national exhibition from ANPEX 82, where he was the SA Commissioner, to Olymphilex 2000. His efforts at exhibitions ranged from organising teams of volunteers, erecting



frames, and at several shows he would volunteer to camp on site providing overnight security. He was, however, best remembered at exhibitions for conducting tours for school groups and his popular stamp-related games.

As the Stamp Promotion Council changed into the Australian Philatelic Federation Mike became their Philatelic Development Officer for several years. His commitment to youth philately in this period saw the development of Santa Cards and other promotional products, collector workshops, and the Young Collector magazine. Here in South Australia his commitment to youth philately culminated with the formation of a number of Junior Stamp Clubs. He also had a significant presence at several of the state's country clubs acting as their Association delegate. His "whiteknuckle" trips to Port Pirie, Snowtown, Tintinara and back to Adelaide the same night became the stuff of legend. In 1985 his efforts were acknowledged by the state's philatelic community when he was presented with the Briskham Award for services to philately. In 2002 he became the inaugural recipient of the APF SPAN

Award for services to philately at the national level.

About twenty years ago Mike and his family suffered a couple of setbacks, including a house fire, and they withdrew from the philatelic scene. Although Mike was no longer seen at philatelic events he continued to keep a kindly eye on proceedings and quietly continued to offer support, advice, and a number of anonymous donations of material to raise funds for SAPHIL House and the further encouragement of youth and novice philately.

Mike was probably one of my oldest friends in philately and I shall always remember him as the person that introduced me to postmark collecting and the ongoing fraternity of club membership. In the 1970s, Mike would frequently rush around the various homes of junior club members to take them to meetings. He rarely got to one on time and consequently, he was dubbed "the late Mike Munzer". Sadly that has become a reality.

She entered many exhibitions starting at ANPEX 72. Exhibiting both locally and Nationally through the years, receiving many awards from Certificate of Appreciation to Vermeil medals.

Doreen played a vital role in South Australian philately and will be fondly remembered.

Philatelic ponderings



How ugly is this stamp?

As with all philatelic material, this very interesting Cinderella has a story. I'm guessing not too many of these have survived as Dave Elsmore (www.ozrevenues.com/Articles/cinderella.html) lists this stamp on the only known cover! Have you got one tucked away in a forgotten box?

It's a Queensland Patriotic Fund fundraising label. Patriotic Funds were initiated throughout Australia during the First World War. These administered funds were raised to assist those who were serving or had served in the armed forces of Australia or her allies during wartime. The Queensland Patriotic Fund was an initiative by the Lord Mayor, Alf Jones, to coor-

dinate donations to causes associated with the Second World War effort. The Townsville Patriotic Appeal was one of many initiatives to raise funds at that time.

Information from Trove in the Townsville Daily Bulletin (Qld : 1907 - 1954), Tuesday 8 October 1940, page 4, reported the following:

"The members of the Commercial Travellers' Club are leaving no stone unturned in advancing the cause of their candidate in the Townsville Ugly Man's Competition, **Mr. A. Dale**. They have opened their campaign with a novel stamp idea. On the stamp appears the distorted face of their candidate, and the words Townsville, N.Q., Ugly Man, 1940, Patriotic Appeal.

The stamps will be on sale at stationers and other shops and business Arms and private citizens are asked to purchase them and affix them to letters they are posting, in addition to the regular postage stamps. It is felt that, in addition to raising funds, the idea will be a good advertisement for the city and its patriotic effort. The stamps will be on sale on Wednesday."

The stamps went on sale on Wednesday 4th October 1940 and were available through "stationers and other shops and business Arms" to be fixed to letters. I was unable to locate who designed and printed the stamp or the cost of each stamp, but the Appeal certainly captured the imagination of Queens-landers with many innovated ways explored to raise funds for this worthy cause!

In another article (Trove, 22 Nov 1940) it was reported that "the effort, which took the form of the Ugly Man competition, finalised on Tuesday evening, brought the total collections by the Townsville and District Patriotic Fund to £4300. When it is recollected that the Fund was only inaugurated in June last, the performance must be classed as a very creditable one. Of this large sum, £1860 was raised in the Ugly Man Competition. In this competition it was arranged that 75 per cent of the proceeds be devoted to the British Bombing Relief Fund and a cheque representing this percentage will be drawn within the course of a few days and will be handed to his Worship the Mayor for despatch to London."

Not a bad effort, Mr A Dale, Townsville's Ugly Man!

Experimental Guidelines for Frugal Philately

"Frugal Philately Class" is an exhibition class which concentrates on the criteria of treatment, importance, knowledge, research and condition. The purpose is to provide an opportunity for collectors to display interesting items and enhance their philatelic skills rather than blunt their cheque books. The availability of such a class encourages those who are put off exhibiting by the alleged high cost of items needed to compete in the normal classes.

Entry Requirements

- One frame exhibits of 16 pages will be accepted at Congress in South Australia.
- Also any philatelic class can be exhibited in Frugal except for Literature and Youth.

Special Conditions

• The wholesale value of the exhibit should not exceed \$200 per frame or \$12.50 per sheet.

This year the SAPC are holding a Frugal Challenge, and the Circuit Book Office is sponsoring the Cup.
