To the Editor,

Washing off Peel & Stick Stamps? A question in Perforated Points (Salisbury bulletin).

A fellow collector of Salisbury Club showed me how to wash off Perel & Stick stamps. Pour 1 or 2 drops of Zippo on back of the stamp paper and after 10-15 seconds you can lift the stamp off the paper.

I could not buy Zippo but was advised to try Diggers White Spirits (used in dry cleaning). I bought a litre, and tipped a small amount into a small container, dropped the stamp in and depending on thickness of envelope could peel the stamp off (sideways) ,this left the adhesive on the stamp. (this was done outside due to the fumes). It did not take long to dry.

Then when dry smother the adhesive with Johnson's baby powder and rub in, this is to negate the glue.

In my opinion glue on the stamp strengthens the guts and nicks on the stamps, which is built by Australia Post , to self destruct.

Reading editor's notes on washing stamps P.P No. 168 that glue left on the stamps is detrimental when in contact with water. This process of using White Spirits evaporates quickly and does not have contact with water.

My question is: Can any member with chemistry knowledge confirm if the process will have long term storage effect on the stamps.

Thanks for your letter Reg.

I have asked a couple of people involved heavily with stamps and they are not sure about long term effects of using Diggers White Spirits would be, but they did say that they would be using unscented talcum powder instead of Johnson's baby powder.

If any other members have any suggestions or an answer re the chemical side of the process please let me know and I will put the responses in the next issue of the SAPC News

# Jeff Newman - Order of Australia Medal





Congratulations, Jeff on being awarded the OAM in the Kings Honour List on 11th June 2023.

Jeff Newman born 10 April 1935 at Orroroo, his father was a stock agent, manager. Soon after the family moved to Bordertown for primary school education. Later they moved to Adelaide where he attended the Unley High School for secondary education. Jeff won a Commonwealth Scholarship to attend University of Adelaide.

Graduating with a Bachelor of Electrical Engineering in 1956. In 1957 he started work at Philips at Hendon, transferring to Sydney in 1978 as their property manager. Retiring in 1997 after 40 years service. He married Dorothy in 1963, they have twin boys Robert and Richard, then Ian and Fiona.

His stamp collecting began in 1943 when he was eight years old, and a class mate Brian Harradine gave him a Globe Album on his eighth birthday. When at University he lived at the Methodist Student Hostel, South Terrace, Adelaide and met Asian students studying under the Columbo Plan, exchanging stamps.

Ted Miller, Vern Stalley and Bill Stewart were the stamp dealers of the day, strategically placed half way between the University and South Terrace. In 1957 he joined the Southern Districts Philatelic Society where he became the hard-working Sec. Treasurer in 1966 until 1975 when he became President for three years. Jeff was made a life member 1973.

In 1958 he joined the PS of SA, then in 1959 joined the Malay Study Group being member No. 77, now No. 1. In 1960 he joined the Brighton PS (Victoria) as they had an active Malay Study circle.

He had been the Southern Districts representative to the Philatelic Advisory Council and became president in 1972/73 of that organization.

At that same time Adelaide hosted ANPEX 72, a national exhibition of which Jeff was on the management committee and had been a tireless worker.

Recognition for this gained him the Briskham Award in 1971. The highest award achievable for outstanding voluntary services to the philatelic world. Jeff is the youngest person to gain that award at 36 and now the longest serving member.


He is one of only two people to gain such an award in two Australian States. He is a life member of the Philatelic Society of Australia. In retirement he is a volunteer at Philas House, Sydney and is a member of the house committee. He was awarded the Philas Award for Meritorious Service to Philately in New South Wales.

Jeff has exhibited in State, National and International exhibitions since 1962. He put on a 200-page display at Philas House for his eightieth birthday entitled Malaya. Recently he presented two displays for ANPEX 22, fifty years after his first 1972 entries.

He and Dorothy still keep in touch with members of the old Southern Districts club in Adelaide.

# SAPC Sponsor - Community PS

Community Philatelic Society members and friends have enjoyed an active involvement in philately since 1959. We welcome all visitors and new members to continue this great hobby.



#### 1959

The first meeting was held in the garage of Chappie Underdown. He answered an advertisement that had been placed in the local "Community News" by Gordon Sanderson.

On 23 October 1959, 12 people attended the first meeting and Chappie Underdown was elected President. At the second meeting the name COMMUNITY was chosen. Nick Yelland is the only surviving member from that meeting.

#### 1961 - Affiliation with the SAPA

Community became affiliated with the SAPA (now SAPC) in June 1961.

#### 1965 - Stamp Vision issued

CPS published their own newsletter "Stamp Vision". The first issue was in 1965 and Vic Leski was the editor. We had many editors over the years including Vic Leske, Les Munn, Allen Downes to name a few.

#### 1967 – Rapid expansion of Philately in SA

- Expansion of the society meant that two other branches were started, Christies Beach (Noarlunga area) in February 1967 and Victor Harbour branch in October 1975. Victor Harbour closed its branch in 2000.
- The cost of the hire of our first venue Toc H Hall was £1 5/- per month with the annual fees being 10/-. Meetings were held on the 4th Friday of each month. By 1970, the membership increased from 12 up to 300+ members with over 100 of these being juniors.
- Over the years Community has hosted many events, including fairs, At Home's (Open Days), Congress, Birthday events and many trips celebrating anniversaries. Events were held at various venues including Marion, Westlakes and Noarlunga shopping Centres, and club rooms changed from Toc H Hall, Cosgrove Hall, Marion Bowling Club and Croquet Rooms, and is currently at Edwardstown Baptist Church community centre.

#### 1968

Marion Council Mayor Grey was not only a Patron of the club, he also presented many of our members with awards for outstanding service to the society over the years. He retired as Mayor in 1968. Members of the society were honoured by having club competitions named in their honour; they were Keith Barron (covers), Doug Welch (pot pourrie), Ken Perry (thematic), and a Seniors Member Trophy.

#### 1971 - Compex

At Homes (open days) were the forerunner of Compex Events and in 1971 the name changed to Compex. These events where held as a common meeting ground for members to gather from around the State to discuss all aspects of the hobby with others; the enjoyment was gained from differing views of the hobby!

#### 1974 - First Congress

- CPS hosted the first Congress in South Australia in conjunction Australia's first National Stamp Week on Saturday October 12, 1974, from 10am - 10pm. It was the most extensive event held in that year and was the first philatelic event that a club or society hosted.
- The theme was a Nationwide Thematic Competition with over 60 entries were received, judges included CR Curtis, B v Tenac, N Cammiss, J Molloy, B Wajer, W Pohl, P Stalley, J Koch, and B Assherton. Trophies were donated by SAPA Club Competition Winners Trophy, the Latham Roberts Medal for best Commonwealth material, and CPS trophy for Best Thematic Entry.

# SAPC Sponsor - Community PS

#### 1974 - Themex

Themex 74 was the first National Thematic Exhibition in Australia based on Thematics. There were 3 classes; a) about telling a story, comparison or development of the story, b) was the reason for the issue (e.g., silver wedding) and c) for the design (flowers, birds, etc).

#### Awards 1967 - 1976

- CPS received many awards from Stamp News in their Most Active Society Competition. The club won 4th
  Division in 1967; 1968 won 2nd Division; 1972 runner-up for the Grand Award; 1973 Certificate of Merit
  runner-up, and in 1976 Certificate of Merit Highly Commended Award. We also received a trophy from
  Stamp News for the most Progressive Society in Australia.
- Over the years, many of our members have achieved awards at the highest State and National levels, this
  includes 13 Briskham, 2 Butler, 1 MAP, and 3 SPAN awards, all for being highly involved in philately for
  many years. Many of our members have held positions at State level, from President to committee members.
- Research, publishing of books and articles, achieving Gold Medal Awards for exhibits and Judging at all levels of philately state, nationally and internationally.

#### 2014 - Unincorporated

In 2014, CPS became unincorporated and donated \$250k to the SAPC for the refurbishment of SAPHIL House.

#### 2023

CPS continues to be an active and contributing philatelic society in South Australia. There are currently 20 members, and the society holds two major auctions per year that generates funds for the society as well as for the SAPC. We also have a social media page on Facebook.

Without the hard work and devotion from many of our early and current members, CPS would not have had the impact that it does on philately in South Australia. Our thanks go out to all our members, past and present, who are still actively involved in philately in South Australia.

# Postal History talk

#### Postal History at the Tea Tree Gully & District Historical Society.

Convenor of the Postal Stationery & Postal History Society, Martin Walker, gave a presentation on Collecting Postal History at Tea Tree Gully on 21st June. The talk dealt with the many interests that could be pursued in collecting postal history. From origin to destination, covers can feature postmarks, postal rates and routes, famous senders and addressees and these topics were dealt with in the presentation.

The post offices at Tea Tree Gully and the means of carrying mail on the north-eastern postal route were featured with great interest shown in the mail coaches and early motor vehicles used.

There were 2 dealers present, Martin Walker and John Cornelius, who appeared to have been doing fairly steady business throughout the day.






# Club News – Australian Postcard Society Open Day

# Club News – Port Pirie

#### PORT PIRIE PHILATELIC SOCIETY 90th Birthday

The first Port Pirie Society (foundation date unknown) went into recess at the outbreak of the First World War. In August 1933 Herbert J Stacey arranged a meeting amongst a group of stamp collectors for the second week in October. At this meeting of 24 collectors the Port Pirie Philatelic Society was founded. The first president was the Reverend John James Kilmartin, a Methodist minister. Shortly after foundation the Reverend Kilmartin transferred to Hamley Bridge. He was the recipient of the Briskham Award in 1970.

In the 35 years from 1933 to 1968 the Society built up a circuit book scheme which became the largest Exchange Circuit in the Commonwealth. This circuit had members in locations from Perth to Fig Tree Pocket & Toowoomba in Queensland and to Moonah and Launceston in Tasmania. At times some 40 circuit books would be out on circuit around Australia. In 1951 the Society printed a book of its financial members and their philatelic interests. In that year there were 190 financial members. To be included on the circuit one had to be a financial member.

The late Jock Borthwick, a foundation member, received the Briskham Award in 1973 after some 40 years of membership. April 30th – May 1<sup>st</sup> 1983 saw the Society celebrate its Golden Jubilee in conjunction with the South Australian Philatelic Association's 10th Congress. Commemorative envelopes were produced for the Golden Jubilee (April 30<sup>th</sup>) and Congress (May 1<sup>st</sup>). A Jubilee Vintage Port (600 bottles) was bottled by St. Hallets Winery in Tanunda and sold out at \$7.00 per bottle.

The late William (Bill) Passaris was the recipient of the Briskham Award in 1982. Bill's name was synonymous with the Society and when he moved to Adelaide in 2006 he remained keenly interested in the ongoing activities of the Society.

The Society held its 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary dinner on November 24<sup>th</sup> 1993 in Maestro's Restaurant in the Port Pirie Festival Theatre complex. On November 24<sup>th</sup> 2008 the Society celebrated its 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary with a dinner at the Risdon Hotel. A commemorative envelope was produced for this milestone in the Society's history.



In 2021 Society president Geoff Edwards received the Briskham Award. Geoff was also a member of the now-defunct Moonta, Snowtown and Southern Districts societies.

On Monday November 27<sup>th</sup> 2023 the Society will celebrate its 90<sup>th</sup> Anniversary with a luncheon in the Port Football & Community Sporting Club. A commemorative envelope will be produced. For a philatelic society to survive 90 continuous years is an amazing achievement. There have been many challenges along the journey including membership levels fluctuating quite markedly through that time.



In the past 12 months the Society has welcomed 6 new members and it now has members who reside in Wallaroo, Port Broughton, Clements Gap, Crystal Brook, Clare, Laura, Spalding, Booleroo Centre, Napperby and Port Pirie – a vast area. Having meetings at 2pm has been the saviour of the Society as night travel to the towns mentioned is just not safe.

Members would prefer to see kangaroos on stamps rather than on the road at night. It will be a serious challenge to reach the Centenary of the Society in 2033.



# In Philately - Tributes to Friends

#### **Joy Lower**

Joy and her husband Harry joined the Salisbury Philatelic Society in 1997, giving them the honour of the club record for the longest continuous membership. Joy saw her role as supporting Harry in his hobby of stamp collecting and exhibiting.

When Harry became president, Joy's support continued by welcoming members, helping with display frames, and also working in the kitchen either at club meetings, fairs or festive events. Some of the best times I had with Joy were in the kitchen catching up on families, interests and generally covering and sharing any subject with our philatelic family.

Joy was also a former member of The Tea Tree Gully Stamp Club, PSSA and secretary of the SA Frama group. Joy took great pleasure in putting on displays not only at Salisbury but also by invitation, she put on a display of phone cards for the Campbelltown 25th Anniversary in 1995 and in 2000 Eastern Districts invited Joy to exhibit her P-Stamp collection.



# **Member Contribution**

#### Stalley's Stamp Shop

Some readers may recall Adelaide's oldest and enduring stamp shop. Well, it is just over fifty years since they moved from their 'Cowra Chambers' outlet, where they had been operating since 1945 to their second home in 'Brookman Buildings'.

Being non superstitious they opened for business April 1<sup>st</sup> 1972, 35 Grenfell St. This spacious ground floor outlet on the southern side with windows facing north into Grenfell St. Only being a short distance east from the ground floor accommodation in Cowra Chambers. This was to be short lived as it too was to be demolished as part of the \$13 million dollar projected Stock Exchange Plaza.

They then moved to ground level Shop 24, Da Costa Arcade at 68 Grenfell St. where I worked for Peter in 1978. Stewart's Stamp Shop had street frontage in the same building.

When Mrs. Connie Stalley turned 70 in 1982 they moved to their holiday home at Victor Harbor, vacating Adelaide completely. Peter set up shop, down stairs as a mail order operation with selected call Clients. Peter attended the London World Stamp Exhibition in 1980.

# Perfin Collecting

In philately, a perfin is a stamp that has had initials or a name perforated across it to discourage theft. The name is a contraction of perforated initials or perforated insignia. They are also sometimes called SPIFS (Stamps Perforated with Initials of Firms and Societies).

Great Britain was the first country to use perfins, beginning in 1868. The practice spread quickly to Belgium (1872); Denmark, France, Germany and Switzerland (1876); and Austria (1877); the U.S. finally allowed perfins in 1908.

In Britain unused postage stamps could be redeemed for cash at the post office. By agreement with postal authorities, a perfin stamp on a letter could be used only by the owner of the perfin. Therefore, a stolen perforated stamp would be of no value to the unauthorized bearer. Thus the use of perfins gave organizations better security over their postage.

The demise of the perfin came about by the widespread use of postage meter machines, which obviated the need for perfins.

A number of countries have perforated stamps to denote official mail. Denmark punctured stamps for use by the Danish Home Guard. The United States has punctured stamps for use by various Federal organisations and Australian states such as Victoria and Queensland used perfins widely on their stamps.

Formerly considered damaged and not worth collecting, perforated postage stamps are now highly sought after by specialist collectors. It is often difficult to identify the originating uses of individual perfins because there are usually no identifying features; for instance the Kodak company used a simple K as their perfin, but on its own a stamp perforated K could have been used by several other users. A K perfin still affixed to a cover that has some company identifying feature, like the company name, address, or even a postmark or cancellation of a town where the company had offices, enhances such a perfin.




