He developed a computer program for the management of the mounting and dismounting of exhibits that has been successfully used at many exhibitions since that time.

Neville has also been a member of the Australian Postcard Society since 2009 and has organised postcard auctions for the club. Neville also has prepared the catalogue for the SAPC and Community auctions.

Guidelines for Circuit book sheets

- Make sure that your pages are tidy
- Do not overcrowd pages
- Writing to be clear and easy to understand
- Do not put damaged material onto the sheets
- Ensure stamps, mini sheets and covers have been securely attached to the pages.
- When mounting covers use glue to secure the mounts not sticky tape. Cut of the bottom off old envelopes to use as mounts.

Numismatic Society of South Australia—1000th meeting



In 1926, a group of collectors interested in currency and related subjects decided to establish a formal collectors' group, which they named the 'Numismatic Society of South Australia' and held its meetings in the Classical Association Room of the University of Adelaide. This was after some three hundred informal numismatic meetings held in the Coin Room in the South Australian Museum building. An enamelled Membership Badge was produced for members based on the iconic 1852 Gold Adelaide Pound.

This Society went into recess from 1931 to 1938, and during the Second World War it held lunch-hour meetings. In the years lead-

ing up to the change to decimal currency in Australia membership grew rapidly—it seemed that everyone was collecting pre-decimal coins and banknotes before they were withdrawn and replaced by the new decimal currency

In 1966, the Adelaide Coin Club was established to cater for those collectors interested in buying and selling coins and notes, and its main focus was holding coin auctions. The Numismatic Society catered for those collectors who were also interested in the study of currency and related subjects; a handful of collectors belonged to both organisations.

The Society has published 'Numis-News', an early record of meetings, and also 'The South Australian Numismatic Journal', whose name was later changed to 'Australian Numismatic Journal'. To promote interstate friendship, the Society held joint numismatic conferences with the Numismatic Association of Victoria for a number of years.

In 1985, the Society became a sponsoring society of the Numismatic Association of Australia (NAA), which holds biennial numismatic conferences involving speakers from Australia and overseas. In October 2015 the Numismatic Society of South Australia sponsored the NAA conference here in Adelaide as we are doing in October 2024. The Society has maintained strong links with the Art Gallery of South Australia through the Gallery's coin, medal and banknote collection. Highlights of this significant collection have been made available for viewing on several occasions exclusively to members of the Society. The Gallery has published a book on the history of its 'coin room' written by member, Peter Lane, titled "*The Coin Cabinet*".

Some notable names include James Hunt Deacon, 'numismatologist' of the Art Gallery and author of '*The Ingots and Assay Office Pieces of South Australia*'; John Gartner, founder of the '*Australian Coin Review*', Syd Hagley whose famous collection had a proof 1930 Australian penny; and Ron Grieg, co-author of '*Communion Tokens*', which deals mainly with Australian and New Zealand pieces. Mick (Michael) Vort-Ronald, a current member, is a renowned bank-note expert and has authored many books on the subject.

In 2023, the Society moved their Thursday night meetings to the Naval, Military and Air Force Club of SA. The Society maintains a strong linkage to The Royal Australian Mint who again this year are attending the Society's Coin, Banknote and Collectables Expo at the Torrens Parade Ground in October 2024.

A recent highlight at Glenside was The Postage Stamps of China by David Gilbert. David's display demonstrated the power of the use of propaganda through repeated use of images of Chairman Mao Zedong to reinforce his leadership.

The display starts on 1st October, 1949. In the 5 years after 1949 a total of 41 sets of stamps were issued, and of those only 7 included an image of Mao. During the Cultural Revolution (1966-76) there were 22 sets issued, over half of which had an image of Mao, with the others including poems and other writings.

Port Pirie Philatelic Society 90th Birthday



The first Port Pirie Society (foundation date unknown) went into recess at the outbreak of the First World War. In August 1933 Herbert J Stacey arranged a meeting amongst a group of stamp collectors for the second week in October. At this meeting of 24 collectors the Port Pirie Philatelic Society was founded.

In the 35 years from 1933 to 1968 the Society built up a circuit book scheme, which became the largest Exchange Circuit in the Commonwealth. In 1951 the Society printed a book of its financial members and their philatelic interests. In that year there were 190 financial members. To be included on the circuit one had to be a financial member.

The Society held its 60th Anniversary dinner on November 24th 1993 in Maestro's Restaurant in the Port Pirie Festival Theatre complex. On November 24th 2008 the Society celebrated its 75th Anniversary with a dinner at the Risdon Hotel. A commemorative envelope was produced for this milestone in the Society's history.

On Monday November 27th 2023 the Society will celebrate its 90th Anniversary with a luncheon in the Port Football & Community Sporting Club. A commemorative envelope will be produced. For a philatelic society to survive 90 continuous years is an amazing achievement. There have been many challenges along the journey including membership levels fluctuating quite markedly through that time.

In the past 12 months the Society has welcomed 6 new members and it now has members who reside in Wallaroo, Port Broughton, Clements Gap, Crystal Brook, Clare, Laura, Spalding, Booleroo Centre, Napperby and Port Pirie – a vast area. Having meetings at 2pm has been the saviour of the Society as night travel to the towns mentioned is just not safe.

Members would prefer to see kangaroos on stamps rather than on the road at night. It will be a serious challenge to reach the Centenary of the Society in 2033.



Riverland Philatelic Society 60th Birthday



The first meeting of the Upper Murray Philatelic Club was held in September 1953. The Club's founder was Duncan Barnet of Barmera.

The first President was Don Brooks and the first Secretary was Duncan Barnet, both of Barmera. The committee had a member from each town.

Some time in the late 50's the Club became Riverland Philatelic Society, and then in 1985 changed to Riverland Philatelic Society

Inc. It is the oldest club in rural S.A.

During the early years the meeting place was rotated across the Riverland towns until it settled in Barmera, then for many years meeting at the Berri Primary School, and then back to Barmera. At present we are meeting in the Reading Room at the Berri Library.

The club has had many ups and downs with numbers from 40-50 in the early years. In 1960 there were 30 adults, and in 2003 we had 19 adults and 30 juniors. School visits by two members to the Barmera Primary School and Glossop High School helped raise the junior numbers.

Over the years we have held two Congresses, Renmark 1987 and Berri 1996, also three stamp fairs 1989, 1991 and 1993.

There have been many club exchange visits with Mildura and Murray Bridge. Last year a bus load of our members attended the Salisbury Fair. Visit from Adelaide Clubs have been enjoyed too. When the Club was larger, guest speakers were a regular addition to our meetings.

At present we have 13 very active members. We celebrated our 60th birthday with cake, displays, and philatelic camaraderie.

In Philately - Tributes to Friends

Harry Lower

Harry and his late wife, Joy, joined the Salisbury Philatelic Society (SPS) in 1979, giving them the honour of holding the longest serving continuous membership, although in recent years, health concerns prevented them both from regular attendance.

Within just two years of joining, Harry's philatelic knowledge was legendary. In the first issue of *Perforated Points* (the SPS Club Magazine), which was published in 1981. It was reported that in the previous year Harry had won just about everything except the final night's quiz and that was because he was the quizmaster and had devised the questions so ineligible!.

In 1983, Harry came second place in a postal-entry quiz conducted by the *Stamp News* magazine. His hours of research were justly rewarded as the prize was a 5/- Sydney Harbour Bridge stamp. The record does not say whether it



was mint or used, but it would have to be worth a few hundred dollars in today's money.

By 1985, Harry had begun to win medals at the State Philatelic Congress exhibitions. He progressed to entering both National and International exhibitions and in 1988, when Adelaide hosted a bi-centennial state exhibition, Stampex 88, Harry won the coveted Grand Prix award for best in show. At Stampex 99, a National Exhibition also held in Adelaide, Harry again won the Grand Prix award. Prior to this Harry had also made his foray into International Exhibiting, entering the exhibition held in Auckland, New Zealand in 1990. These three outings were all with the same exhibit.

Harry was elected SPS Club President in 1989 and occupied the position for the next five years. Also in 1989, Harry was awarded the Vic Smith Trophy, the Club's highest individual honour, which he won again in 2010.

In 1991, SPS explored changing their club emblem, which at the time was a colour image of the Sturt Desert Pea, difficult to reproduce with the copying methods of the time. Harry's preliminary design, based on his interest in colonial-period South Australian stamps, won the members' vote and was refined to become the emblem still used by the club.

In 1995, Harry signed the SPS Honor Roll and in September 2003, Harry was granted Life Membership of the Society, which was celebrated at a dinner at the Salisbury North Football Club.

Harry also joined the Philatelic Society of South Australia when the South Australian Study Group was formed in 1985. Harry was involved in the study group for many years and wrote several excellent research articles for *The Shilling Violet*, a regular publication of that Society.

Harry was also a member of the Royal Philatelic Society of Victoria and even as recent as three months ago on 15th June, Harry entered their Annual Competition with his "1891 Surcharges of South Australia" coming runner-up, receiving one of two medals awarded.

They say that a rough rule of thumb is that for every 50 stamp club members, possibly 10 will display at club or state level. Of those 10, maybe 5 will go on to exhibit Nationally and of those 5 maybe one will go on to exhibit Internationally. Harry was certainly the one for SPS.

Harry penned these few words not long before his passing "I started collecting stamps from 1970 and formed three major collections each winning gold medals at International Exhibitions, which is one of the highest medal levels".

I have been privileged as Australian Commissioner to numerous overseas exhibitions to be entrusted with taking one of Harry exhibits and having the pleasure of emailing him whilst away to report that he had earned a Gold medal.

Records held by the Australian Philatelic Federation, the peak National body for stamp collectors, that I have access to, shows Harry's exhibiting record over the last 13 years as follows –

One Frame Exhibits - Six different titles used achieving 3 Gold National, 2 Large Gold National and 1 Gold International.

Multi Frame Exhibits - Three different titles used achieving Gold National, Large Gold National and Gold International.






Jack Peake

Jack was born at Penola in 1917 and educated at the Gilles Street Primary School, Adelaide High School, and the Adelaide Teachers College. He taught in various secondary schools, both city and country, for over twenty years and then transferred to tertiary education. During the next twenty years he lectured students who were later to graduate as technical studies teachers.

Scouting was a lifelong interest, especially in the field of Scouter training and camping. For services to the Scout movement, he gained Life Membership and was awarded the "Silver Kangaroo" and the "President's Medal".

Emanating from his Scouting interests was the practice of keeping and illustrating a Log Book of touring holidays, which contained well over 2,000 sketches of places all over Australia. He also illustrated

quite a number of books, including *Middleton*, and *Currency Creek* for me and others for Nelson Eustis.

Jack always had an interest in the finer details of stamp collecting the KGV issues. He hand illustrated first day covers because being in the country, he could not obtain them readily. Today his unique covers are the most sort after covers. He produced an enormous number exhibition souvenir promotion covers dating back to 1955 until his death in September 2006, some illustrated below.

Jack was a member of the Southern Districts for almost 50 years, 18 of these serving as those as President (1988 to 2006). He was made an honorary member of the Australian Airmail Soc in 1994. Stampex 86 saw him as product coordinator.

In 1998, Jack was awarded the Briskham Award at the combined dinner of the Southern District's 60th and the Airmail Society's 30th anniversaries.




