

The Gawler Cultural Heritage Centre wins another National award

Town of Gawler's 'Down the Line' exhibition has received the 2023 Interpretation Australian National Award for Excellence in the Indoors: Under \$75,000 project category.

The exhibition, which opened at the Gawler Heritage Gallery in May, explores how the postal service, the telegraph and the telephone exchange kept the Gawler community connected to each other and the wider world. This is the third Interpretation Australia national award won by the Gawler Cultural Heritage Centre The aim of this exhibition was to deliberately target two groups of people in the community with stories and learnings around communication. Young people whose experience of personal communication is smart phone driven and very much focused on individual handheld devices and older people who have lived experience of more outmoded communication practices.



The exhibition explores the growth and changes in technology that have led us to the era of smart phones and explores the challenges of the preceding technologies. It also aims to reconnect older people with their memories of STD calls, operator enabled calls, receiving telegrams and aerograms and the hobby of stamp collecting.

You can view rare early colonial letters, telegraph equipment brought to South Australia by Charles Todd and a collection of funky antique phones. Play with exchange equipment and listen to the voices of the women of the Gawler telephone exchange as they 'connect your call'.

Visitors are encouraged to see if they can beat the clock with a letter sorting challenge and try their hand at morse code with our telegraph equipment. They can connect to the hobby of stamp collecting through the free giveaway packets of fun and colorful stamps from around the world.

This exhibition is an opportunity to understand more about the evolution of communication technologies that have been fundamental in keeping communities informed and connected.

In their summation, the expert panel of judges commented on the innovative submission we presented which included a short film. They commented that the exhibition was well thought out and artfully executed.



Club News - PSSA

John Walker presented a display of historic perforation gauges. He introduced his display noting that, when postage stamps were first introduced with the 1d Black in 1840, they were imperforate. However, with the development of a perforating machine by Henry Archer, Great Britain issued the 1d Red with perforations in 1854. Within a few years almost all stamp issues world-wide had become perforated.


The French defined a standard method of perforation measurement, being the number of perforations per 2cm. It is not known when or where the first perforation gauge was developed but the first example in John's display appeared in the 1890s.

The early gauges were printed on card, which tended to deteriorate with use. To make gauges more durable other materials were introduced, such as brass, aluminium and plastic, notably the popular Trafalgar Series of plastic gauges.

(Of particular local interest in John's display, was the etched aluminium gauge developed by Bert Wajer, a noted Adelaide philatelist and a member of the PSSA.)

John Walker also noted that nowadays there were also electronic perforation gauge detectors (costing some \$400) that, at the touch of a button, gave an accurate perforation read-out.


John's display showed an extensive range of historic printed card gauges, and it was noted that these were often used to advertise stamp dealer businesses. For example, the Peerless stamp gauge developed by G. F. Rapkin would often be overprinted with a dealer's business name and contact details.

A significant section of the display covered the development and promotion of a brass gauge by Dr. Lucas

Benham. Lucas Benham was a UK medical practitioner who migrated to South Australia and set up a practice in Semaphore. John's display included examples of Dr. Benham's gauge as well as correspondence with Stanley Gibbons Ltd seeking its endorsement. There was also a letter gifting the gauge to the Duke of York (later King George V, a very keen philatelist).

John's display included examples of stamps showing different perforation types e.g., single line, comb and compound perforations, as well as varieties such as double perforations and mis-placed perforations. Also displayed were examples of Russian and Finnish stamps with their distinctive serpentine roulette perforations.

This was an excellent and highly informative display of an essential philatelic accessory that is often just taken for granted.





General information

Dies for 1965 Anpex Briskham Awards

Following the closure of Allan J Olson Pty Ltd badgemaking and medallion factory on 30 June 2023, Barrie Newman, Executive Director of The Adelaide Mint, was able to retain the obverse and reverse dies and their striking collar of the ANPEX 1965 Briskham Awards medallion and present them to the SA Philatelic Council at the delegates meeting on 13 November 2023.



These two unique dies (each 50mm x 30mm) fit tightly into the special striking collar made to house the dies in the press, with the Obverse die featuring Adelaide's GPO and Victoria Square and includes spaces at the top, to allow the winners names of the various classes, to be engraved on each medallion after judging had been completed. At the bottom of the Victoria



Square image is the wording "10th Australasian National Philatelic Exhibition" which indicates that it is ANPEX 1965. The Reverse die features the head of a young Queen Victoria as printed on the penny stamp first issued in Australia in October 1855. It is hoped that these specially engraved dies and collar can be displayed in SAPHIL House with other philatelic memorabilia.



The Briskham Award has continued to be presented by the SA Philatelic Council annually as an individual award to the SA club member who is considered to have given many years of outstanding meritorious service to philately in South Australia. The current medallion does not show the details of awards and classes on the Obverse as did the first medallion issued for ANPEX 1965 but is of the same size and thickness (4mm) of the original medallion.

In Philately - Tributes to Friends



Andrew Murrell was a valued member of Lower Murray Philatelic Society who was an amazing character with many stories to tell. He joined in 2002.

The following article *The Mannum Mag* is a tribute to Andrew's colourful life. He will be missed.

Vale Andrew Douglas Ambrose Murrell

Born: July 22, 1945, Adelaide. Died: 9th October 2023, Mannum

Art Dealer and Oil Painter Challenged Norms

South Australian art dealer and oil painter Andrew Douglas Ambrose Murrell came from an established Adelaide family of doctors and engineers and used his creativity to challenge societal norms.

He was an avid art and stamp collector, oil painter and prominent South Australian dealer in the 1980s operating out of the well-known London House in Strathalbyn.

Educated at St Peter's College, he excelled at music and drama and his first job after leaving school was working for Channel Nine in Melbourne, in the golden days of television with Bert Newton and Graham Kennedy. He later returned to Adelaide working in the airline industry.

The youngest of five children, his father John William Murrell was an engineer who was responsible for setting up the sewage system in Adelaide and played football for Geelong, the Tasmanian State team and Norwood. His mother, Beatrice Alice Calvert was the daughter of noted Huon Valley orchardist and politician, The Hon William Henry Fairfax Calvert.

His eldest sister, Dr Helen Calvert Murrell, was a pioneering gynaecologist working in India and the UK, his brother, Professor Timothy Murrell, a medical educator, his sister, Ruth Barbour (nee Murrell), was a nurse and his eldest brother, William (Bill)

Murrell, was an industrial engineer.

Andrew Murrell self-published a number of poetry books and co-wrote a musical about Monarto, progressive Premier Don Dunstan's ill-fated plan to build a new satellite city on the Murray River plains.

Art ran in the family as his mother's favourite uncle, Eric Wright, was a finalist in the Archibald prize in 1946 and 1947. Wright painted a beautiful river scene near Forest Home, the award-winning orchard in Judbury in the Huon Valley, Tasmania where Andrew Murrell's mother grew up. This painting was a wedding gift presented when she married in New Town, Hobart in 1926. She was a descendant of first fleet convict James Morrisby.

Andrew Murrell's brief but intense career as an oil painter helped him overcome alcohol addiction while in rehabilitation at a half-way house in Semaphore from 1988-89. He held a number of exhibitions which sold out quickly, including at the Sailmakers Gallery in Port Adelaide.

A deeply spiritual man, many of his works were of icons of Saints, including Mary and Jesus. His unique signature is an iconic representation of many religious symbols, including the word DOM, short for Dominus, the Latin word for master or God and the Cross of St Andrew, in honour of his Scottish ancestry.

The oil painting Mrs Brewster Jones' Garden in Victor Harbor is one of his most famous works and was originally commissioned by the mother of John and Rick Brewster Jones - founding brothers of one of Australia's most popular rock bands 'The Angels'.

This painting of the mother of Australian rock royalty brothers, standing still and stoically in her garden in 1988 captures a historical moment at completely odds with the high energy mayhem of the band's on-stage presence of its lead singer Doc Neeson.

The artist's stunning Monet-like use of colour, the handsome gilt frame and impressionist style make it one of his more memorable works. It now hangs in the Fairview Art Collection in Perth. Andrew Murrell's own anti-establishment, irreverent and rebellious personality is reflected in the painting and captures an intergenerational moment that is subtly at odds with the changing social values of Adelaide society in the 1980s. A cultural identity expressed and tapped into so successfully by the performances and lyrics of the rock star sons of the subject matter.

Ultimately, the painting was not to Mrs Brewster Jones' traditional taste and it was subsequently purchased by her good friend Beatrice Alice Fairfax Murrell (nee Calvert), mother of Andrew Murrell.

What Andrew Murrell learnt from dealing in art is that you own a piece for a while and then you pass it on and you should never get attached to a painting.

"It always moves. The more it moves, the more you see. And the more you learn," was his personal motto on art.

A portrait of Andrew Murrell by well-known South Australian artist Timothy Messack was a finalist in the Doug Moran portrait prize in 1987.

Andrew Murrell is survived by his long-term partner Leslie Fraser.





What can I use instead of stamp hinges?

The alternative to using hinges is the system of transparent mounts – gummed strips or 'pockets' – which employ the 'slipin' principle (rather like your stockbook) with transparent fronts and black or clear backing, tailored to fit your stamp and sold in convenient singles or strips.
