Sponsor - Mt Gambier Philatelic Society

After an initial expression of interest meeting held in October hosted by Lloyd and Esma Perry at their home in Webb, Mt Gambier, the inaugural formation meeting was held on 10th November 1954 in the Rechabite Hall with 15 in attendance. The Mt Gambier Philatelic Society became the eighth philatelic society formed in South Australia.

In the early years meetings were held alternating between Millicent & Mount Gambier as there were just as many members from the Millicent district as Mt Gambier. On occasions, meetings were also held at Yallum Park homestead.

As life member Ian Fergusion recalled, in 1960 or 61, I drove my father's car with 4 others to Yallum Park. The trip was via Mt. Burr, Kalangadoo, Nangwarry, Penola and then to Yallum. We didn't see any kangaroos, not like it is today. The display was in the hands of Alec Hicks of Kaniva, which included two full sheets of the five-shilling Sydney Harbour Bridge, one mint and one cancelled to order. Combined meetings were also held in Naracoorte with fellow stamp collectors from Keith, Bordertown and Naracoorte.

Over the years the club has held numerous exhibitions with stamp displays at Penola RSL, Robe

RSL, Mt Gambier RSL, Riddoch Art Gallery, Mt Gambier library as well as the current clubrooms at O'Halloran Terrace, Mt Gambier.

The official opening at 2.30 was televised by the local TV station SES-8, and broadcast in black and white as colour was not introduced until 1972.


Reidy Park Community Centre is the current home of the Mount Gambier Philatelic Society.

Life Membership

On the 31st May, Martin Walker was awarded the South Australian Lifelong Historian Award at the History Council of SA gathering to mark the end of the History Festival.



Martin has dedicated more than 50 years to researching and collecting the postal and telecommunications history of South Australia. He curated an exhibition of South Australian philatelic and post office history for the joint Texas/South Australian sesquicentennial. In addition to supporting

numerous local exhibitions, Martin has contributed material to a display of Gawler's role in WW1 for an exhibition in Cannakale, Turkey for the ANZAC centenary, as well as an exhibition in South Africa for the centenary of the Anglo-Boer War.

Martin understands the value and importance of reaching new generations and new audiences to instil a love of history. Importantly, he also recognises that people have different ways of engaging with knowledge and digesting information.

Further, Martin, also received the President's 2024 Trophy for Research, received from the British Society of Australian Philately.

This Society, dedicated to the study, research and promotion of the collecting of Australian stamps and postal history was originally founded in 1933 as the Australian Commonwealth Specialists Correspondence Society of Great Britain

You probably already know this about Harry Butler!

He was a local lad from Minlaton and was a pioneer Australian aviator, Captain & Chief Flight Instructor in the Royal Flying Corps during World War 1.

His monoplane was called the Red Devil and he flew the first over-water flight in the Southern Hemisphere carrying airmail between Adelaide and Minlaton in August 1919. In Minlaton, you can find his monoplane, huge colourful murals, a life-size bronze statue, and well-tended signage telling the story of his life and his legacy.

You can only imagine how proud I was to be awarded the prestigious perpetual Harry Butler Trophy at CONGRESS 2023.

Just to know that I had been nominated in recognition of my commitment to our Club by the members, was overwhelming and a most humbling experience. It has been such a privilege and an honour to be the custodian of this highest State Club Philatelic award, (an enormous piece of history), and to have had it hanging in our lounge room for family and fiends to view has given me the biggest thrill. I can't thank the club members enough for taking the time to nominate me for the Award.

If you have a person who you know works tirelessly for the good of your club and all the members, please do not hesitate to recommend them for the Harry Butler Award.

This is a 'once in a lifetime' opportunity for the recipient and will definitely become a much honoured and treasured memory.

In Philately - Tributes to Friends



John Bodnar 1950-2024

John has been a member of the philatelic community in Adelaide for many years. From his local club, the Woodville Philatelic Society, John's interest in the philate-

ly of his parents' homeland saw him form notable collections of Russia and Ukraine material.

This interest expanded to the airmail service that operated between Kiev and Vienna at the end of the First World War. The success John achieved with this study brought him to the attention of the late Nelson Eustis and he was invited to join the Australian Airmail Society becoming a member in 2000.

In addition to John's role in the Australian Airmail Society, he was also a member of the Philatelic Society of South Australia, the Postal Stationery & Postal History Society of Australia, several overseas study groups, and a past member of the Woodville Philatelic Society and the Ukrainian Collectables Club. He was also an avid collector of picture postcards and a foundation member and vice-president of the Australian Postcard Society.

In 2009 the Airmail Society successfully nominated John for the South Australian Philatelic Council's award for meritorious service to philately — The Briskham Award. He also trained as a judge of philatelic exhibits achieving both state and national qualification.

For many years John has been an active participant at club meetings showing a variety of material reflecting his many interests. Many of them were introduced with some of the most memorable talks and expressions of John's personal values.

For the Australian Airmail Society, he leaves a substantial gap in the society's operation that will be a challenge for any one person to fill.

Ray Garlick 1938—2024

Ray will be well-known to many readers as he was a member of so many clubs. To my knowledge he belonged to The Australian Airmail Society, Philatelic Society of South Aus-

tralia (Daytime Group), Printed Collectables Club, Salisbury Philatelic Society and the Lower Murray Philatelic Society.

I remember him most from the Postal Stationery & Postal History Society. He used to come to meetings with bundles and bundles of used monev order advice envelopes and proceeded to give them away to grateful postmark collectors. At that time, he collected commemorative and pictorial postmarks of Australia and postmarks of South Australian and Northern Territory post offices. As a life-long employee at the Adelaide Mail Exchange he was well-placed to obtain the latest information about openings, closings and name changes of post offices and soon provided a service to fellow club members securing covers commemorating these changes. In my own collection there are covers produced by Ray dating back to the late 1970s right through to when he retired from Australia Post in 1993.

Retirement allowed Ray to spend more time with his hobby joining new clubs and pursuing new collecting fields. He is best known by the current generation of collectors for his interest and passion for trams. He formed a massive collection of picture postcards and ephemera relating to South Australia's tram services. When he could get no more, he expanded the collection to take in all of Australia and then the world! He was a foundation member of the Australian Postcard Society in 2009 and contributed to many of that society's meetings. He displayed postcards depicting trams, the Adelaide General Post Office and, after purchasing Betty Van Tenac's collection, cards of the New South Wales mining town of Broken Hill.

Ray lived all his life in the western suburbs. He was a keen follower of the Adelaide Crows FC and enjoyed 1950s & 60s music. He died in hospital on 12 June after a brief illness.

He will be well remembered as a one of Adelaide's good club members.

Air Mail Saves Time -Making your letters fly in rural South Australia.

The early development of commercial aviation around the world was often dependant on the income received from air mail contracts. The presentation was on how fledgling airlines in South Australia grew into powerful transport companies as they developed air mail services between Adelaide and the state's regional centres prior to the outbreak of World War Two.

At the Community Philatelic Society meeting on April 19, Grayham presented some of his AusPost Stamp and Collector pack collection. This huge collection was interesting and generated a discussion around the importance of the stamps in the packs being postally used as possible future rarities.

Most people tend to keep the packs intact rather than using them for postage. We all know that less mail is circulating, which is expected to keep declining, so postally used stamps that have limited print runs will be sought after. Thanks Gray for bringing in your collection and for the interesting discussion.



It was a pleasure to see Di's Gold winning entry from Congress 2023 at our meeting on 17 May. Celebrating Women in German History 1986-2003, the exhibit covers women from the 1700's to the late 1990's.



Di's research into the women and the impact that they have had as well as the part they have played in German history is incredible.

An illuminating fact that Di shared with us was that of all the stamps that have been produced in the world, less than 1% have commemorated women.

At our meeting on the 21st June David P showed two frames of Falkland Islands and one on Falkland Dependences. It was a wonderful display encompassing the early stamps including some covers, a map, and other ephemera to enhance the display.


Glenside Philatelic Society

Inheriting a stamp collection

Many people at some time in their lives inherit a stamp collection from a relative. Often the person inheriting the collection has no idea of the value of the collection or what to do with it.

Never ever throw out a stamp collection just because you don't want it. There is always someone who would like the stamps, no matter what the value or condition. There are a variety of things you can do with a stamp collection, but the first thing you must decide is whether you want to keep it, and this often depends on its value, however, value should not be the deciding factor.

Firstly, you could decide to take up collecting stamps for yourself. Stamp collecting is one of the world's most popular hobbies that satisfies our collector instincts as well as providing an insight into the history, geography, and culture of the countries whose stamps we collect. Many people also consider it therapeutic and a relief for stress. Secondly, if you decide that you do not wish to take up stamp collecting, the next step is to determine the value of the collection.

Most collectors collect stamps because of the enjoyment of the hobby, which are built up from stamps from the mail or packets sold at the post office or elsewhere, and will usually be the most common values. Many old stamps were issued in very large quantities and as such hold very little value. As a result, most collections are not worth a fortune.

Many people overvalue the stamps in their possession. It is important to remember that just because a stamp is old does not mean that it is valuable.

The value of a stamp is determined by both supply and demand and more importantly the stamp's condition. A stamp that was printed in large numbers will rarely have much value. Similarly a stamp which is very rare is of little value if there are few people wishing to buy it and/or it is damaged and full of rust, which is a fungus that destroys paper and is recognised as brown spots on a stamp.

Finding help

At SAPHIL House we have very knowledgeable philatelists who will help you with your collection, and advise you on the best way to dispose of your collection

- We also have 18 local stamp clubs and 9 country clubs throughout SA & NT. Clubs are another great sources of knowledgeable philatelists who are more than willing to discuss your collection with you. If you would like to join a club and start collecting yourself, you can find a list of our clubs on the back pages of the SAPC News or visit our website.
- While the internet is a fabulous resource for exploring stamps, you do need to be mindful that you most likely do not have the rare million dollar stamp in your collection. Scams are prolific on sites such as Ebay, just because it has a high buying price, does not mean it is valuable. Having said that most people will want tos tart their stamp journey looking up stamps online.
- The SAPC website has many useful links to explore philately and to connect with online communities around the world. It is worth noting Graham Beck's YouTube channel "Exploring Stamps", which is a fabulous resource. 









